Preparing your Child for Anesthesia and Surgery



A Word to Parents

When a child needs surgery, parents may feel frightened for their youngster and a bit overwhelmed with the numerous hospital procedures.

Our anesthesia staff has compiled this brochure specifically for parents. It is designed to address parental concerns and to help parents prepare their child for surgery. We encourage you to review this information. Contact your surgeon, dentist or our Anesthesia Department with any questions.

Talking to your child about surgery

- Parents can prepare their child for surgery in several ways. First, it is important to let your child know in advance that he or she will be having surgery and to explain, in simple terms, what will actually happen during the day.
- If your child has never been to a hospital, many things adults regard as routine can be surprising and worrisome. For example, they will be asked to remove all of their own clothes and wear a hospital gown. Be honest about the experiences that may be unpleasant (such as having blood drawn) and offer reassurance about experiences that may be strange, but not painful (such as having x-rays taken or being transported to the operating room.) Our goal is to be as accommodating as possible to your child's concerns.
- If your child has been to the hospital before, he or she may have specific worries. Your child should be encouraged to talk about these concerns and be provided with accurate information.
- Among the most reassuring things you can tell your child about surgery is that it will soon be over. It is also helpful to explain the reason for the surgery. Parents can serve as good role models by remaining calm, positive and comforting before, during, and after their child's surgery.

Your child's diet prior to surgery is very important. Anesthesia is safest when administered on an empty stomach. The dietary guidelines listed below must be followed to help ensure that surgery does not get postponed or canceled.

DIETARY GUIDELINES – VERY IMPORTANT! PLEASE REVIEW THESE THE NIGHT BEFORE SURGERY!

- **6 Months to 3 Years:** Milk, formula or solids up to six hours before surgery.*
Clear liquids up to two hours before surgery.
- **3 Years and Older:** Nothing to eat after midnight or up to eight hours before surgery.*
Clear liquids up to two hours before surgery.

Clear liquids **include water, apple juice, ginger ale, plain Jell-O, and Pedialyte. Clear liquids **do not include** tea, coffee, milk, formula and juices with fruit pulp (grapefruit, orange and tomato.)*

MEDICATION

Children requiring medication should take them as instructed. The medication can be taken up to one hour before surgery with a small amount of clear liquid or plain Jell-O. You will be advised in advance about considerations pertaining to your child's specific medications. If there are questions or if you did not receive instructions, please call the Anesthesia Department.

ILLNESS

Please notify your surgeon or dentist if your child develops a cold, fever, asthma attack or any other illness within a week before surgery.

Please proceed to Parking Lot A. Enter the hospital under the awning located adjacent to Parking Lot A and check in at “Registration.” Once registered, you will be escorted to the Surgery department. Arrive at the hospital ***one hour before the scheduled time of surgery.*** This is needed for registration, examinations, and other assessments by your child’s nurses, doctors and anesthesiologist.

Children under age 18 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian bearing proof of guardianship (paperwork from court.) In the situation of unmarried parents, only the biological mother can give consent. Patients 18 years and older who are not competent to consent to receiving anesthesia or undergoing a surgical procedure must have their court appointed guardian give legal consent to the planned procedure, either by phone prior to the procedure, or in person the day of surgery.

IMPORTANT - Prior to the day of surgery, court issued guardianship papers must be provided to the anesthesia department at Franciscan Hospital for Children.

Post-Surgery Care


When your child’s medical condition has stabilized you will be given verbal and written instructions for home care before you leave the hospital. Your child will then be discharged when you are comfortable with this plan.
