What's in this lesson?

There are a variety of materials included here for our clean/dirty themed group activity. Please feel free to try any or all of them, depending on what works best for your child and your family. You do not need to focus on all of these target areas! Please feel free to contact your child's speech-language pathologist if you're not sure which materials may be the most appropriate. Have fun!

Clean/dirty Video

This video is an introduction to the clean/dirty group and displays a book reading of 'Clean, Not Clean' with a simple clean/dirty sorting and washing activity. Feel free to pause the video to find the 'clean' or 'dirty' items on the pages or to have your child request continuation of the book (e.g., 'more' or 'turn the page'). Feel free to replicate the clean/dirty sorting and washing activity with objects/toys around your home (see PDF of symbols).

Books:

- 'Cleaning My Room' RAZ book (see PDF) - associated symbols also in PDF

You may choose to:

- read these books with your child
- identify 'clean' or 'dirty' items on each page
- answer questions 'what/who is dirty?' or 'what/who is clean?'
- count the number of clean/dirty items
- use clean/dirty symbols to match to the picture/item on the page (see attached PDFs)

Follow-up Activities and Carry-over into home/daily life

- Clean/dirty sorting activities
 - low-tech
 - Use clean/dirty board and clean/dirty photographs
 - Discuss/sort what items are clean or dirty
 - objects -> look, touch, smell the dirt on items/objects vs. look, touch, smell clean items/objects -> sort them into clean/dirty buckets

- Carry over into the home activities
 - taking a shower/bath
 - washing hands (see PDFs attached)
 - helping do laundry
 - helping do the dishes
 - helping wash the car
 - playing outside (mud/dirt? water?)
 - picking up/cleaning up toys or bedroom (see visual schedule PDF)
 - making a mess/cleaning it up (washing the table) -> 'Wipe it Clean'
