Speech Group Activity Week of 7/6/20: Beach 1

What's in this lesson?

There are a variety of materials included here. Please feel free to try any or all of them, depending on what works best for your student and your family. Picture symbols of vocabulary words related to the beach. Print/cut these out or take a screenshot on your device, then model the use of these words (e.g., by touching these picture symbols on the paper/screenshot or on your child's speech-generating device) during the activities.

Follow along with this read-aloud of the book <u>Let's Go to the Beach</u> with object exploration. Feel free to pause the video to discuss objects/vocabulary during the story.

Feel free to add other things to the bottle (e.g., glitter, sand, little sea shells, small plastic sea creatures, etc.). Recipe: 1/3 of bottle water with blue food coloring, rest of bottle fill with oil (vegetable oil or baby oil work well)
