


Speech Group Activity Week of 7/27/20 Camping 2



What's in this lesson?

There are a variety of materials included here. Please feel free to try any or all of them, depending on what works best for your student and your family. You do not need to focus on all of these target areas! Please feel free to contact your child's speech-language pathologist if you're not sure which materials may be the most appropriate. Whatever you choose to do, have fun!

• Camping Vocabulary (PDF)

Picture symbols of vocabulary words related to this week's camping stories. Print out or take a screenshot on your device, then model the use of these words (e.g., by touching these picture symbols on the paper/screenshot or on your child's speech-generating device) during the activity.

• Our Camping Trip book reading (Video Link and PDF)
Follow along with this video read-aloud of a story about a boy and his family's camping trip. Feel

- Camping Sounds PowerPoint (PowerPoint/Link)

A PowerPoint presentation that includes larger photographs of animals and nature items that you may see/hear when camping paired with a short audio clip with the sound that you would expect to hear from each image. To view as a slideshow, choose "Slide Show" -> "Play from Start" from the menu bar at the stop of the page. Click on the speaker symbol or the image to hear the audio clip on each page.

- Backyard Camping book and sequencing activity (PDF and Boom Card Link)
 Read this story, Backyard Camping, about two sisters who set up their tent and went camping in their backyard. When you're done reading, follow the Boom Card link to match the photos to the text to sequence what the girls did first, second, third, etc. while camping in the book. https://boom.cards/fastplay/orvpv
- Leaf Art (PowerPoint/Link)

When you go camping you may go on a nature walk or hike and can collect leaves along the way. Leaves from different trees or bushes may look or feel different. You may choose to use crayons to press the leaves on the paper and rub the crayon to create a leaf rubbing or you may choose to use paint to paint the leaves and press/rub them on the paper to make a leaf print. Follow along with the PowerPoint for step-by-step directions for leaf rubbing/tracing with crayon.
