Speech Group Week of 8/3/20: Amusement Park



What's in this lesson?

There are a variety of materials included here, all related to the theme of amusement parks. Please feel free to try any or all of them, depending on what works best for your student and your family. You do not need to focus on all of these target areas. Whatever you do, have fun!

• At the Amusement Park Intro and Visuals (2 PDFs)

Brief introduction to amusement parks, and picture symbols of vocabulary words related to the "At the Amusement Park" story. Print these out or take a screenshot on your device, then model the use of these words (e.g., by touching these picture symbols on the paper/screenshot or on your child's speechgenerating device) during the activity.

- "At the Amusement Park" (video link and PDF)
 In this video, we'll review what an amusement park is, and then read a story about a boy going to an amusement park. You may want to ask your student to answer the Yes/No questions (i.e., "Would you try it?") throughout the story.
- Addie's Choices Visuals (PDF)
 Picture symbols of vocabulary words related to the "Addie's Choices" story.
- "Addie's Choices At the Amusement Park" (video link and PDF)
 In this video, we'll read a story about a girl at an amusement park who makes choices about what ride to go on, game to play and food to eat.
- Cooking Project: Making Corn Dog Muffins (PDF)
 You don't need a deep fryer to make these delicious corn dog muffins! Some students might enjoy this hands-on cooking activity, making something inspired by food at the amusement park.
- Amusement Park-Comprehension Worksheet (PDF)
 As a follow-up to the "At the Amusement Park" story, some students might want to answer comprehension questions from a field of 3 choices.
- Addie's Choices-Comprehension & Sorting Worksheets (2 PDFs)
 As a follow-up to the "Addie's Choices" story, some students might want to answer comprehension questions from a field of 3 choices. Or they might want to sort pictures into two categories: rides or foods.

• Your Choices (PDF)

Some students may want to make their own choices about what they would do at the amusement park. Print this out or pull it up on your device and have your student indicate what they want to do!
