



Figure 2. Percent Limited English-Speaking Households in Massachusetts, Boston, and Allston/Brighton, 2018-2022





Figure 4. Percent High School Students Reporting Current Binge Drinking, Massachusetts (2021), Boston and Selected Boston Indicators (2021)




Figure 5. Percent Students Reporting Current Marijuana Use, Massachusetts (2021), Boston and Selected Boston Indicators (2021)

Figure 6. Percent Students Reporting Current Electronic Vapor Product Use, Massachusetts (2021), Boston and Selected Boston Indicators (2021)






Figure 8. Percent High School Students Reporting Being Overweight, Massachusetts (2021), Boston and Selected Boston Indicators (2021)

Figure 9. Percent High School Students Reporting Obesity, Massachusetts (2021), Boston and Selected Boston Indicators (2021)




Figure 10. Percent High School Students Reporting Drinking Soda Weekly, Boston and Selected Boston Indicators (2021)

Figure 11. Percent Students Reporting Not Eating Breakfast on All 7 Days, Boston and Selected Boston Indicators (2021)





Figure 13. Percent Students Reporting Having Been Taught About AIDS or HIV Infections in School, Boston and Selected Boston Indicators (2021)




Figure 14. Percent High School Students Reporting Current Sexual Activity, Massachusetts (2021), Boston and Selected Boston Indicators (2021)

Figure 15. Incidence of Sexually Transmitted Disease, Crude Rate per 100,000 Population, Massachusetts and Boston, 2022




